

Jesus Christ light of the world





#### What do you remember from today's reading?




Jesus tells the crowds two short stories to explain what being a disciple means, and to show us that if we want to follow him we must give up everything.

What do you think "giving up everything" means?



I think that it means that we need to try to see that Jesus is the most important person in our lives.



We must also "carry our cross" which means accepting the things we find difficult in our lives and asking for God's help in these difficult things.

These difficult things might be people we find it hard to get on with, lessons in school that we find boring or wanting something we can't have. It might be not having enough to eat or even living somewhere where there is violence.

For a few moments in silence, think about what you find difficult and ask for God's help now.

Then still in silence pray for each other - that God will be with all of us. While we do this, we know that we are all supported in prayer.

Let's look at the two stories now...

The first story is about a man who wants to build a tower. He must work out the cost to make sure he has enough money and resources to finish the job.

The second story is about a king who is going to war. He must first count his soldiers and resources to make sure he can win the battle.

#### What do you think these stories are telling us?



Jesus is telling us that following him and being a disciple is something that we have to see through to the finish. We need to follow Jesus always and this isn't always easy. Often we are distracted by other people or by thinking about what we want, rather than about what Jesus wants for us.

Throughout our lives as followers of Jesus we might have to choose to do what Jesus wants even if it means not always being popular.

It is hard but God is with us all the way to help and guide us.



In silence, pray for each other - that God will be with all of us.



Jesus asked us to follow him and so we pray together:

We pray for world leaders, for compassion, strength and wisdom to guide their choices.


We pray for the world that in this moment of crisis, we may reach out in solidarity to our brothers and sisters in need.
