


News from the PTFA

Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

If your child qualifies for free school meals, they will have a **healthy meal every school day**, and can get:

- access to free holiday activities within the HAF Programme
- additional funding for their school (Pupil Premium)
- holiday food vouchers*

Even if your child automatically qualifies for universal infant free school meals, please still apply to access the above benefits.

All pupils approved for free school meals will remain eligible until they finish the school phase they are in on 31 March 2025.

Reception and Key Stage 1 parents and carers

Please remember to only use disposable BBQs in a safe location, and be aware of any High Fire Risk warnings which will increase the risk of using these, why not Bring a Picnic Instead.
