
#### Where is summer?

# Reading – the gateway to learning!

Please record this in your child's reading record and ensure that they bring both their reading book and reading record to school every day. Please also record if they are reading other books from home or the local library! If children can read fluently, they will enjoy their reading more and be able to access their learning more easily.

#### Packed lunches and healthy snacks

We have noticed that children are having crisps, biscuits and chocolate bars – even doughnuts at break times for their midmorning snack. Please can you ensure that these snacks are either fruit or raw vegetables. Thank you.



# Attendance Matters Every Day Counts....

### Free School Meals in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2

As you may already be aware, Universal Infant Free School Meals are automatically offered to all pupils in reception, year one and year two.

If you receive any of the following benefits, please complete the pupil premium application form. This will secure extra funding for your school which can be used to support your child in school or help with the cost of uniforms or trips.

The criteria for free school meals/pupil premium is as follows:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit: if you're not entitled to Working Tax Credit and your annual gross income is no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' payment (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit: if your household income is less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
