

We are still and silent as we reflect on God's word for us in the Gospel.



What do you remember from today's reading?

In Jesus' time the Pharisees, who were very powerful people, and the ordinary Jews washed their hands and their arms all the way up to the elbow before eating.



Who here washes their hands before eating? Why do you think we do this?



The Pharisees and Jews washed their hands before every meal so that their hands were clean, and so they didn't get ill. But also because it was a tradition. It was a part of their religion.

They had many other religious traditions too - can you remember which other traditions we heard about in the gospel? The Pharisees were surprised when they saw that Jesus' disciples had not washed their hands in the traditional way. The Pharisees questioned Jesus about this. What did Jesus say to them?



Jesus became angry with the Pharisees. He said that they were just following their traditions without really thinking about God. This was not enough. For Jesus it was very important for people to really show love for God in all their actions.



What traditions do we have for how we worship God and to show that we believe? Some of us go to Church on Sundays and on other special days, we say our prayers, we might wear a cross around our necks. These are all important, but do you think they are enough?

For example, what do you think Jesus would say to someone who went to church every week, but who was mean to other people? Do you think they are showing their love for God in their actions? The children at St Francis primary school in Goosnargh have set up a CAFOD club. They meet at lunchtimes and do activities to try to make the world a better place.

They raise money to help people who are poor. They have debates. They have written to their MP about what they think needs doing to help others. And they have done a walk to show that they care for and support refugees who have to flee their homes. One of the children says, "It might take a while, but we can make a difference."

How do you think these children are showing love for God in their actions?

We know that God loves us and so we pray together:


We pray for the leaders of the world: that they may follow the example of Jesus, who cared especially for people who were poor and sick.
