Advent Day of Faith

Last week, Mrs Myatt and our GIFT team organised a wonderful day for us to reflect on the importance of Advent, a time of waiting for Christmas. Fr Francis joined us for our Liturgy in the hall. During the day, the children had the opportunity to reflect on the Christmas story in our prayer space. They all made their own baby Jesus and took home a good deeds manger. They also made cards for people in our local community who may not get Christmas cards.



As part of this day, the GIFT team had arranged for donations of boxes of biscuits for Gillingham Foodbank and for The Vale Pantry to be placed in Christmas hampers and given to families in need.

On Wednesday, Mrs Myatt delivered the biscuits and this is what Gillingham Foodbank said: "Please give our thanks to the children for the magnificent donation this morning. The total weight of the goodies was 22.2 K and attached are a couple of photos to share with them. The large amount of bags is all 60 hampers waiting to go out later next week."

Colder weather

As the weather is getting even colder and is forecast to remain so, please ensure your children bring their coats, hats and gloves etc. into school – we are **still** having children coming to school without coats. This is especially key when there are so many coughs and colds around.





Scarlet Fever

You may have seen reports in the national media about a rise in cases of scarlet fever and Strep A. Though national figures are higher than expected, there are processes in place in Dorset to help reduce the spread should cases appear in our school.

Scarlet fever Signs and symptoms

Scarlet fever is caused by a bacteria called group A streptococci, or "group A strep". It is very contagious for people who are in close contact with one another through infected droplets in coughs, sneezes, mucus and saliva. Typically, it causes a mild illness for most people however treatment with antibiotics is important to avoid complications.

Some symptoms of scarlet fever include:

- sore throat
- headache
- fever
- a fine, pinkish or red body rash that feels like sandpaper

Winter is a time where several viruses, coughs and colds spread easily and most people will recover with self-care at home. We continue to encourage good infection prevention control measures such as regular hand washing, covering your mouth when you cough and sneeze and to throw tissues in the bin when used.

Advice for parents

We would encourage parents to keep their children off school and nursery if they are feeling unwell, and to contact their GP practice or NHS 111 if they have concerns that their condition is worsening. Children who have been prescribed antibiotics should stay home for 24 hours after starting the antibiotics to avoid spreading infection to others.

To ensure all people have an opportunity to see their children, please only attend the one performance. Thank you for supplying costumes and supporting your child in learning their lines.

Hot school meals

Unfortunately, Chartwells, our food provider, have had to increase their prices. As has been widely



reported, the UK is facing inflation levels not seen for over 40 years, with the cost of food rising significantly.

These figures are reflected in our own purchasing. In addition to this food price inflation, they are also experiencing significant increases to labour. **Therefore, from 1st January 2023, the price of a hot school meal will now be £2.60**.

Please make sure that if you want to order hot school meals for the first week back in January, you need to do so by Monday 12th December. Thank you.

Government departments track school attendance figures. We have a whole school attendance target which is 96.5%. Currently, our attendance is well below that figure.

I will be sending out a letter to parents of children with attendance lower than 95% in order to keep you up to date with what percentage your child has, and alerting you if they are at risk of persistent absence. If you need help before you hear back from us contact your GP, nearest walk in centre or dial 111. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). To prevent the health professional from sending messages to you, text STOP to our number. Messages are charged at your usual rates.
