Please also record if they are reading other books from home or the local library! If children can read fluently, they will enjoy their reading more and be able to access their learning more easily.

Scholastic Book Fair

The PTFA have also organised for the Scholastic Book Fair to come to school next week. It will be open in the afternoons for you and your child/ren to browse and buy. It arrives on Tuesday 21st March and will be collected on Tuesday 28th March.



This is a wonderful opportunity to receive free books for the school if we make £300 worth of sales. Obviously, the more we sell, the more free books we receive and it is operated on a % basis. So, it would be lovely to see as many of you as possible at the book fair and please do encourage family members to spend as well using either of the payment methods below.

This year, we are going cashless and there are 2 ways of paying for any books you want to buy.

The first is through a QR code for you to scan using your phone that we will have at the book fair. This will take you through to the secure payment site that is linked to our school.

All you need to do is bring your books to a member of the PTFA team, so that we can record the sale, and then use the QR code.

The second is through a wish list. The children will be given a chance to visit the book fair during the week and may come home with the wish list. You are then able to pay at home using <u>www.bookfairs.scholastic.co.uk/pay</u> and selecting our school from the drop down menu.

If you choose to pay using this link and the wish list, all you need to do is pay online and then return the wish list to school, to our box in the school foyer, and we will sort your books from the book fair and send them home with your child/ren.
