What do you remember from today's reading?

Some wise men arrive in Jerusalem at the court of King Herod, asking to meet the new baby who will be king of the Jews. Who is the baby that they are looking for?

Was the baby Jesus at the palace with King Herod? Where was he?

How do you think Herod felt when he heard that the wise men were looking for a new king? What did he say to the wise men? Do you think he was telling the truth?

The wise men had travelled a long way to see Jesus. How did they know where they were supposed to go?

The star led them all the way to Bethlehem and there they found Jesus. What did the wise men do when they found the child they had been looking for? The star is very important in this story. Why do you think that is?

The star showed the wise men where to go. It was a sign from God for them to follow.

Have you ever been on a long journey? How did you know which way to go?

Our whole lives are like a journey. We have to choose which way to go and whether we will follow God in all that we do.

Will we do the right thing or the wrong thing?

Will we be kind to others and look after them, or will we only do what is best for US? We do not have a star, or a sat nav, to follow each day, to show us which way that God wants us to go.

We might meet people like Herod who try to lead us to do something that we know is wrong. But God has given us Jesus, to show us how we should try to live our lives. And when we pray, God guides us to do what is right, if we listen.

Can you think of any other ways that God guides us to follow the right path in our journey through life?

In silence, pray for each other - that God will be with all of us.



God guides us and shows the right way to live our lives, and so we pray to God together: We pray for all the leaders in the world: that they may be moved not to think of their own power and wealth but to rule wisely and do what is right for all their people.

We pray for the Church throughout the world: that it may shine like the star, leading people to Jesus, and spread God's message of justice, peace and love.

We pray for those people around the world who are undertaking long journeys, or who are in need of guidance: that they may find their way to a place of safety, welcome and peace.

We pray for our school, parish, our family and friends: that we may always be open to following God in our lives, in both our actions and our words.

Generous God, we give thanks for all that you have given us. Open our hearts to follow you so that all that we do may be guided by your love. We make this prayer through Jesus Christ our Lord
