#### Colder weather

Please remind your children to bring their coats, hats and gloves etc. into school – we are still having children coming to school without coats. This is especially key when there are so many coughs and colds around.



# **Coronavirus (COVID-19)**

Please remember, that as we come into the season of coughs and colds, it is still <u>imperative</u> to get your child a **PCR** test if they have developed a **new** cough. Government guidance:

# The main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are:


- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

#### What to do if you have symptoms

If you or your child has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19, even if they're mild:

- 1. Get a **PCR test (test that is sent to a lab)** to check if you have COVID-19 as soon as possible.
- Stay at home and do not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get your test result –
  only leave your home to have a test. <u>Check if people you live with need to self-isolate</u>.


